Important CGFM® Renewal Information

To maintain the CGFM certification in an active status, CGFMs are required to:

- Pay the CGFM annual renewal fee by March 31.
- Complete at least 80 hours of continuing professional education (CPE) in government financial management topics or related technical subjects within each designated twoyear cycle.
- Maintain and provide detailed information on CPE hours completed.
