BIOGRAPHIES

Sherri Voigt, CGFM, CPA, started working for the State of Wisconsin in 1992. She has worked at several state agencies and currently is with the University of Wisconsin System Administration Financial Administration Office. An AGA member since 1995, she joined the local board in 1998. She has also been active with AGA at the regional and national levels.

James "Jim" R. Arnette, Jr, CGFM, CISA, AGA National President, is the Director of Local Government Audit for the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury, where he has worked for more than 30 years. He is responsible for the annual financial and compliance audits of all 95 counties and monitors the annual audits of more than 1,600 municipalities, nonprofits and related local government entities.

Jim Swanke is Director for Risk Management with Willis Towers Watson in Minneapolis. He is also a lecturer at the University of Wisconsin-Madison for sustainability, environmental, and social risk management.

<u>Session information</u>: Extreme weather events and the resulting economic impacts.

Jodi Gissel, PhD, Assistant Professor of Accounting, joined the faculty at Marquette University in 2010 after earning her Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She earned her Bachelor of Science with a concentration in Accounting from the University of Wisconsin-Parkside and her Master of Science in Accounting from Marquette University. Jodi worked at the public accounting firm Gordon J. Maier & Company, LLP, where she gained both audit and tax experience. She is a Certified Public Accountant (Wisconsin) and Certified Fraud Examiner.

<u>Session information</u>: A discussion of preventing and detecting accounting fraud.

Laura Fay is the Agency Liaison for the Bureau of Consumer Protection within the WI Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection.

<u>Session information</u>: Identity theft continues to be the fastest growing crime in the United States. The more you learn about it, the less vulnerable you are. The Wisconsin Bureau of Consumer Protection will explain the different types of identity theft, how to recognize it and how to prevent it – including information about Fraud Alerts and Security Freezes. Receive tips for safeguarding personal information and how to spot the red flags of a scam.

Joe Chrisman, State Auditor. As State Auditor, Joe Chrisman directs the nonpartisan Legislative Audit Bureau. The Bureau also operates a hotline, which investigates allegations of fraud, waste, and mismanagement by state agencies and employees. Chrisman was appointed State Auditor in 2011 and is the fourth State Auditor in the 51-year history of the Legislative Audit Bureau.

<u>Session information</u>: In this session, State Auditor Joe Chrisman will be joined by three audit managers from the Legislative Audit Bureau. This panel will discuss recent audit findings, explore relationships between auditor and auditee, and highlight how auditors and financial managers can work effectively together

Kim Jones joined the Dane County Regional Airport in 2004 and was appointed the Deputy Airport Director-Finance and Administration in 2011. She is responsible for planning and directing the financial management of \$26 million in operating revenue. This includes supervising financial operations, monitoring results of the airport, and developing annual operating and capital budgets.

Ms. Jones has over 30 years of experience in financial administration roles including most recently at the Des Moines International Airport.
