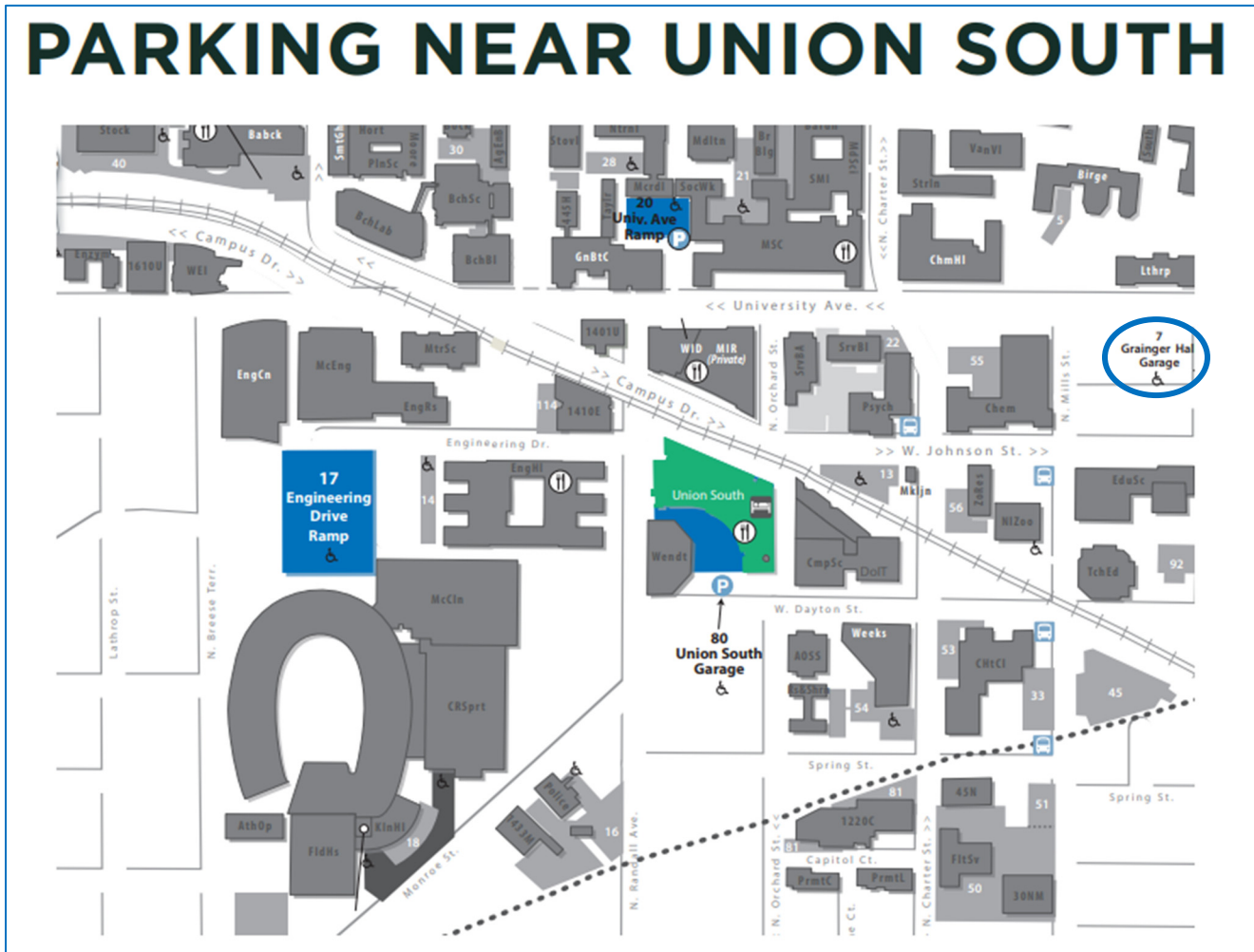

Location Information:

The training event will be held at the UW-Madison Union South located at 1308 West Dayton Street, shown in green on the parking map. Parking under the building (Lot 80) is **extremely** limited and costs \$2 for each of the first three hours and \$1 for each additional hour (4 hours=\$7; the daily maximum is \$15).

The next closest parking ramp is located at Lot 17 on Engineering Drive, across Randall Avenue. Rates are based on a daily maximum fee of \$15. Be aware that the Engineering building construction project is still underway. The parking garage is open at this stage of construction. Please allow extra time to handle morning rush hour traffic and construction detours.



After that, two lots within a few blocks are located at Lot 20, 1390 University Avenue or Lot 7, Grainger Hall Garage, 325 N Brooks Street. Rates are based on a daily maximum fee of \$15.

Session Information

Cybersecurity Trends and Risks (FOS: ITT)

This session examines the current cybersecurity landscape, reviews emerging trends, and explains common threats such as ransomware and data exfiltration. You'll learn best practices for preparedness, explore effective controls and risk management strategies, and understand the importance of vendor risk management. The course also addresses how auditing impacts security and related risks, equipping you with the knowledge to strengthen your organization's defenses.

The Intersection of Culture & Risks, Trends in Today's Workplace (FOS: MGMT)

Every organization has a culture, but not every culture contributes positively to performance. Leaders who intentionally shape the culture can help impact productivity, customer satisfaction, and overall results. This session will discuss the impact of inspired employees on an organization and how culture and risk relate to it.

Fraud, Waste, and Abuse-Trends and Mitigation (FOS: AUD)

In this session you will learn how to define Fraud, begin to think forensically, learn what is the cost of fraud. You will learn how fraud is detected, the most common internal control breakdowns that contribute to fraud, build awareness of the types of fraud, the profile of a fraudster, and common red flags. You will also learn how to respond to an incident of fraud and the best practices for an internal Fraud Program.

Zoo Tales (FOS: AUDG)

The Ohio Auditor of State is independently elected and leads a statewide team of more than 800 professionals dedicated to promoting accountability and transparency across Ohio. The office conducts financial and performance audits, oversees Medicaid audits, performs special investigations, and provides local government accounting services to communities throughout the state.

In this session, "Zoo Tales," we'll share two memorable investigative case studies, featuring a few unexpected animal encounters and cases of fraud, and offering a behind-the-scenes look at how our team uncovers the facts and brings issues to light.
